Our Water Ways March 1, 2024

The Lake Subcommittee's (LC) 2023 recommendations, minutes, and associated documents are in the library.

Progress Work on the culvert between Upper Lake and Upper Stream continued on Monday and Tuesday. The drainpipe has been shortened from where it almost reached into Lower Stream, leaving a remnant that extends just beyond the cement. This short pipe moves water away from, and discourages corrosion of, the concrete frame. The outflow area from the pipe has been formed into a properly sloped dry creek in the style of the Upper Stream bed. Water will flow at the angle of the pipe into Upper Stream.

Q: How were calculations made in the February 16 Gazette regarding the future cost of recycled water in Lower Lake?

Background Lower Lake comprises 78% of the total water among Upper Lake, Lower Lake, and Lower Pond. One consideration is the future cost of recycled water.

Facing a history of cost overruns for recycled water, in mid-2022 the MC began continuously reducing the amount of recycled water throughout the park. The LC measured how much the water could be reduced while still running the spray fountains. By January 2023 a full-year record had accumulated. This record illustrates the cost of the recycled water purchased under reduced water conditions, with no structural changes.



Keep in mind that 2023 was a record rain year, which reduced the amount of purchased water needed to keep Lower Lake full. During an average year we would need to buy more water than we did in 2023.

SLP rates for recycled water were established under our 20-year contract with SVWD. The rate they charge us for *recycled* water, according to the 2004 contract, is 20% of whatever the prevailing *potable* water usage rate

is. [Got that? it's weird. Our contract states that we buy *recycled* water based on a *potable* water rate.] In current times, the prevailing rate at the SVWD website is labeled as the *Landscape Potable* rate.

Scroll down to UNIFORM RATES, and find the lower right, green corner.

You see the rate for Landscape Potable water in 2024 is \$2.40 per hundred gallons. Until the contract expires in mid-October 2024, SVWD charges 20% of \$2.40, which is \$.48 per hundred gallons.

From mid-October onward, SVWD will charge SLP the rate that all other SVWD customers pay, which is the *Landscape Recycled* rate. [Got that? after the contract ends, the rate SVWD will charge us for recycled water will be based on a recycled water rate]. Scroll farther down to -

Starting in mid-October, in less than 8 months, SVWD will charge \$1.64 per hundred gallons, which is more than 3.4 times our current, special contract rate of \$.48.

Starting in January, 11 more weeks later, SVWD will charge the 2025 rate, \$1.82 per hundred gallons, which is more than 3.7 times our current, special contract rate.

In January 2026, SVWD will charge \$2.01, which is more than 4.1 times our current, special contract rate.

In addition, when our contract ends in mid-October, SVWD will begin to charge SLP the meter fee that all other SVWD customers pay. We have a 1" meter. Scroll down to

Using these rates in 2024 to buy the same amount of water that filled Lower Lake in 2023 would cost \$48,941. Upper Lake, Lower Lake, and Lower Pond were kept full until halfway through July, after which recycled water was added to only Lower Lake.

Money Matter\$

The idea of placing a short article in the Gazette, monthly, was discussed in our latest Finance Committee Meeting. The monthly article will help the residents of SLP to stay informed of our finances, upcoming projects, and expenses. In our monthly Management Committee meeting, we review our financial statements, Checking and Savings account balances and our Reserve Fund Balance.

Reserve Fund: mandated by the State of California and is to be held for larger projects for SLP.

In the Gazette, we will recap the information, which was shared in the monthly meeting, as well as any new valuable information.

In the monthly management committee Meeting on February 27th, we reviewed some of the following:

- Bank Accounts balances Averages monthly balances in aggregate remain the same.
- P & L (budget) As of the end of <u>February</u> SLP is favorable by approx.
 \$61,000. The 1st quarter P & L will be available in the April Partner's meeting.
- The 2024 project budget has:
 - \$97,432 reserved for Lakes Projects
 - \$20,000 reserved for common area landscaping between the Lower Lake path and the adjacent homes.
- The SLP tax return has been completed and the K1s are available for pick up at the office, approximately 4 weeks earlier than last year ⁽²⁾
- One home has been sold as of the end of February keeping us on track for the <u>four</u> needed each year to make the Park's contribution to the Chapin payments. This is needed in addition to the partner's monthly contribution.
- The SLV water fee on each partner's invoice will be going down from \$12.66/unit to \$10.29/unit. This will take effect in May.
