## Water Ways March 8, 2024

Ralph Pike retires: After managing the dam at the park's outflow to Camp Evers Creek for many years, Ralph has retired from the task. When storms were predicted, he would open the dam, and water would flow out of the park. This would increase the capacity for storm water in our lakes basin, and counteract erosion and flooding.

Ralph developed a sense of timing, learning when to close the valves toward the end of a storm in order to safely retain the most water in the park. He would walk out onto the dam and open it even when storms hit during winter's longer nights.

Park Manager Jesse Rice will make other arrangements to monitor the dam. Ralph will continue to report weekly rainfall in The Gazette and feed Louise the swan.

**Recycled water status** Through at least one month every winter, rain has kept our lakes and ponds as full as they are in summer without adding any recycled water. This winter, no recycled water has been added since November 8, 2023. Recent storms partially filled Upper Pond and raised the level of Upper Lake enough to run its spray fountain and recirculation pipe.

Clarification about the February 9 column, which described information gathering by the MC. It states [Upper] lake and [Upper] pond would be *filled in with material to a level that would accommodate any storm runoff.* To clarify, the MC is gathering information about the possibility of raising the upper lake and pond beds only to a level that would allow stormwater drainage to Upper Stream with no stagnant water.



**Q:** What unknowns could affect how much water would be needed to sustain our lakes and ponds in the future, if no changes are made?

**Background** The March 1 Gazette showed the estimated future cost of recycled water for Lower Lake, when it is kept as full as it was in 2023. Lower Lake is used as an example because it has roughly ¾ of the total capacity of all lakes and ponds. The estimated cost for a full Lower Lake in 2024 would be \$48,941. Partners' monthly \$24.50 Lake Redevelopment fees total \$65,562 annually, which would cover the estimated expense of recycled water, with funds left over for redevelopment. The estimated cost for a full

Lower Lake in 2025 would be \$132,305, a water expense equivalent to \$49.44 per household monthly, if no changes are made. The estimated cost in 2026 would be \$146,044, a water expense equivalent to \$54.58 per household monthly, if no changes are made.

**Unknowns** include future rainfall. Additional unknowns will be described in future columns. The cost estimates are based on the amount of recycled water we used in Lower Lake in 2023. Record rains during early 2023 kept Lower Lake full. We did not buy any recycled water before April 12 and none after November 8. That's 7 months of purchased water and 5 months of free water in a record rain year. If future years bring less rain—as they have in the past—it would take more recycled water than we used in 2023 to keep Lower Lake full, if no changes are made.
